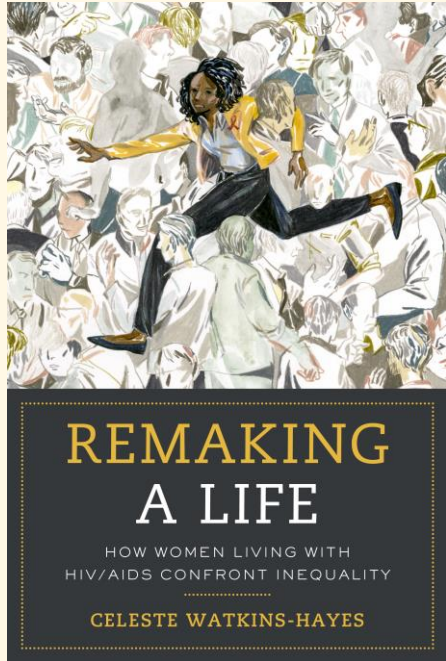

The book has won awards from the American Sociological Association, Association for Humanist Sociology, Eastern Sociological Society, and National Women's Studies Association and been covered by The Chicago Tribune, Ms. Magazine, EBONY, the PBS Newshour, and several public radio and other outlets across the country.
